


Jesus describes himself as the Bread of Life given to a hungry world. He is the manna in the wilderness in Exodus 16. He is the bread of Passover, broken and shared by those who will share his exodus from the slavery of sin and death. Jesus is the sign of God's concern for his people when they cry out in need. God's love always exceeds our need. When we are fully satisfied, there will always be enough left over to share with others.

St. Paul's account of the Last Supper (1 Cor 11:23-28) reveals how the early church understood Jesus' gift of himself. The bread we share is his body broken for us. The cup we share is his blood poured out for the sins of the world.

The Gospels repeatedly refer to the central role of food. Jesus' open table fellowship with sinners is the measure of God's mercy. His parables are often about meals to celebrate the return of the lost, wedding banquets and abundance. The Last Supper is matched by meals after his resurrection when he returns to his disciples to give them his peace and send them forth to preach.

Food is everywhere in the Gospels. Why? Because eating and drinking are the most basic human needs, and they also reflect deeper need, spiritual hungers. We need spiritual food to satisfy the needs of our hearts.

Jesus wanted to provide both. But he didn't want to make this feeding of the thousands a one-time thing. He wanted it to be the center piece of his mission. That is why when the disciples wanted Jesus to "send the crowd away," he rebuked them and said: "Give them some food yourselves."

Those same words are meant for us as well. According to the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organization, nearly 800 million people throughout the world – one out of every nine – suffer from "chronic undernourishment." Children are the most vulnerable victims. The primary cause is poverty. Just as it was for the people Jesus addressed some 2000 years ago.

National studies indicate that almost 15 percent of American households, including some where both adults work, are "food insecure."

On a spiritual level, the need is equally dire. All of us need to be fed – continually.

That's why on the night he died, Jesus implored his disciples: "Do this in memory of me." Have this meal. Be nourished. Feed one another. Encourage each other. Share whatever abundance you have with one another.

At every Eucharist we come together to do again what Jesus did on the night before he gave himself away totally out of love. We come together to be fed, to be challenged, to be encouraged, to be lifted up, to be sent out refreshed and re-committed to feed and nourish others.

If we respond to Jesus' command: "Give them some food yourselves," we will be preaching the Gospel and practicing what we preach.
